How to use your reading record



The reading Record book is a way for you to record the reading that your child does with you at home. Inside the record book you will find lots of useful information about ways to help your child with their reading. Please see the table below for some examples of useful and informative comments that you could write in the Reading Record as a way to communicate this learning with your child’s class teacher.
