

Over this term we would like you to choose a minimum of 8 different activities below as your homework tasks. **Everyone must complete 8 tasks throughout the term.** We hope that by continuing with this style of homework, this will encourage everyone to take part and give parents a chance to become more involved in working with their children on fun, creative and exciting activities. Children's completed homework tasks will be recorded and monitored. **Any children who do not complete at least one homework task per week, either at home or during homework club, will be spoken to and will be asked to stay in at playtimes to complete their tasks.** We will also speak to parents about pupils' commitment to homework tasks. Please ask parents, family members or friends to join in and have fun. You can use your homework task book for writing tasks, evidence logs, saving photo's taken for evidence. When each task is completed you need to bring it in or take photographs as evidence. (These can be emailed to your teacher) As evidence is seen we will tick off your tasks and record your choices. We are hoping by giving everyone choices that a selection of activities will be completed by pupils with support from family members.
